- Joomla! The open source software that powers this site. Joomla! is a fork of the Mambo content management system project that has been out on its own for more than a year.

- Apache The most ubiquitous web server on the Internet, the Apache site plays host to a variety of other open source projects as well as the web server.

- PHP Originally known as "Personal Home Page," PHP has developed into a sophisticated programming language that can be used as in-line coding for web pages or can run as a stand-alone application.
